RMU-healthcare support & hygiene awareness Campaign in Kharepur Village, District Kasur

Abstract

Background: On 6th October 2025, a medical camp was organized by Rawalpindi Medical University (RMU). The RMU medical team successfully conducted the Day 1 camp at Kharepur Village, District Kasur. During the camp, the team provided medical consultations, essential medicines, and sanitary and hygiene supplies to the flood-affected residents of the area. The initiative aimed to deliver immediate healthcare support and promote hygiene awareness among the affected communities.

Introduction

Under the guidance and support of the Worthy Vice Chancellor of Rawalpindi Medical University (RMU), Prof. Dr. Muhammad Umar, the RMU medical team organized a medical relief camp on 6th October 2025 at Kharepur Village, District Kasur. The team departed from Rawalpindi on the night of 5th October 2025 to conduct this humanitarian mission aimed at providing healthcare and hygiene assistance to flood-affected communities.

Details of the Camp Site

The designated camp site was located approximately 455 kilometers from Rawalpindi Medical University. The area serves a local population of around 7,500 residents. The region had recently been affected by severe flooding, resulting in considerable disruption to the community's daily life, infrastructure, and access to basic healthcare services.

Upon arrival, the RMU medical team promptly established the camp and provided a wide range of medical consultations, essential medicines, and hygiene supplies to the affected population. The initiative aimed to restore basic healthcare access, control the spread of waterborne diseases, and raise awareness regarding hygiene and sanitation practices in post-flood conditions.

They coordinated logistics, managed communication between the university team and local authorities, and ensured smooth execution of all camp activities.




Figure 1: RMU Team on the Move – Journey to Kasur




Figure 7: The Patients Demographics and Load on the first day of the activity
